From September 25th to October 25th, almost 3,000 pairs of gently worn shoes were collected from thirty-nine donation sites by over thirty



volunteers. NCJW|MI partnered with WISDOM (Women's Interfaith Solutions for Dialogue and Outreach in Metro Detroit) for the first time. Shoes were collected at houses of worship as well as private and public schools. Volunteers delivered the shoes to our offices where they were sorted from November 1st to the beginning of December. STATE POLICY ADVOCATES

Hip, Hip, Hooray!!

Finally, some good news to report: We've been educating and sounding the alarm about the terrible impact that redistricting and gerrymandering has had on the issues that affect the lives of women, children, and families; and for the need for an independent commission, not the state legislature, to redraw the voting district lines. Last year, we decided to partner with Voters Not Politicians for the petition drive to get an independent commission ballot proposal on the November 2018 ballot. The campaign has resulted in securing more than 428,000 signatures, well above the 317,000 valid signatures required. Once the state verifies that there are enough valid signatures, the ballot language is accepted, and any challenges are met, we are confident that the proposal will appear on the ballot. Before that happens, we will be working hard to get more citizens to register to vote, and to motivate voters to actually vote. In the meantime, the Michigan League of Women Voters has filed a federal lawsuit targeting gerrymandering, and wants state and federal legislative districts redrawn. If you are part

of our Action Alert email contacts, we will keep you up-to-date about the proposal and the lawsuit.

Also, our participation in the second Women's March to Lansing was very successful. We brought 46 women to support the thousands across the country in the drive for expansion of voters' registration, and for women to run for local, state, and federal offices. In speaking with our advocates, it was clear that the spirit, energy, and enthusiasm of the first march is alive and growing.

Hannah G. Solomon Award

Irma graduated from The University of Michigan with a BA in Economics and a minor in Political Science as well as earned her MS in Library Science from Wayne State University.

Irma taught at Hubert Elementary in Detroit as

the library media specialist and served as a temporary assistant principal for one semester. She established the first computer lab for the school, trained teachers and students, and developed a typing course for the classes which was used in other elementary schools. She developed and implemented an after-school reading club for reluctant readers which was very successful and was nominated twice for Library Media Specialist of the Year for DPS.

Irma has had many roles in her volunteer life: President of Eleanor Roosevelt Hadassah; their Woman of the Year; chair of Eye Bank; and co-chair of the archives at the chapter level; a president of Glennwood ORT; served as the region's Education VP; and recording secretary for Beth Achim: served on the board of JCRC for five years as co-chair of the Detroit Jewish Coalition for Literacy; was their Good Deeds nominee; and established the Providence Hospital Medical Clinic's reading program for children.

Irma Joined NCJW/Greater Detroit in 2000 as a Children's Advocate, was co-chair for the 9/11/2001 opening meeting, served as program chair, assistant treasurer, treasurer, vice president, and finally as president. She co-chaired the 125th anniversary celebration of NCJW/Greater Detroit, Currently, Irma is the co-State Policy Advocate for Michigan. This is a national NCJW position. She led the Michigan section on the Women's March on Lansing in 2017 and in 2018. Her main interests are advocacy - obtaining equal pay for women for doing the same work as men (based on personal experience), the establishment of an independent commission to draw up Michigan's voting districts, and the expansion of voters' registration.

Currently, Irma is a member of Adat Shalom Synagogue, Her personal interests are her children, politics, reading, crossword and jigsaw puzzles, mahjong, and she is addicted to BRIDGE.

When Margo retired after forty years of teaching, she wasn't sure what she was going to do with her time. A friend suggested volunteering at the first Back to School Store (B2SS). That was the beginning of her involvement with NCJW.



EDUCATION ASSISTANCE

Education Assistance, the oldest community service project of NCJW|MI, began in 1902 when the Ida E. Ginsberg Fund was established. The fund gave small, interest-free loans to Jewish students in need. In the 1960's, we had two funds: the Ginsberg Fund, renamed the Education Assistance Fund, and the Welling Fund, a grant fund. Today, we have twenty-six name funds, along with the NCJW Education Assistance Fund, and the Maimonides Fund which we administer.

In the beginning, the loans were small and were handled by us on an informal basis. From the start, all loans were interest-free. In the early 1960's, NCJW entered into a consortium with the Jewish Educational Loan Service and our funds were included in the many funds that contributed loans and grants to students. In 2014, Hebrew Free Loan (HFL) established the William Davidson Jewish College Loan Program. A HFL Service Coordinator interviews students, establishes their eligibility, and produces a short biography prior to each of two yearly meetings in which NCJW|MI takes part.

The recipients and their parents continue to express appreciation for the generosity of the William Davidson Jewish College Loan Program fundholders.
