STATE POLICY ADVOCATES

Michigan's mid term election gave a new look to the top offices of our state with three women occupying the posts of governor, attorney general, and secretary of state. So far, Governor Gretchen Whitmer has issued an executive directive that is aimed at creating equity between male and female employees working for the State of Michigan. The order prohibits state agencies and departments from asking or obtaining job applicants' current or past salaries until they are offered employment and compensation. Asking this information in advance can lead to employers making lower offers. Now, state policies and procedures will require compensation to be based on the nature of the work to be performed without differentiation based on gender.

Presently, women in Michigan earn 78 cents compared to every dollar that men make for doing the same job. Non-government employers are not covered by this directive; the state legislature must do so. For too many years, our legislators have not allowed hearings to be held, and for whatever reasons, they have chosen not to address the issue. We have lobbied tirelessly for pay equity and will continue to do so; however, we will try new tactics. Since Equal Pay Day (EPD)

is April 2, and our legislature will not be in session, we will not be rallying at the Capitol. Watch for an update concerning EPD in your Action Alerts and upcoming programs.

Also, Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson has asked Attorney General Dana Nessel to give an opinion on the constitutionality of a lame duck law passed in December that makes it harder to initiate ballot drives. Instead of a set number of valid signatures that can be gathered throughout the entire state, this law requires geographic-based collection of signatures. The law caps total collections at no more than 15% from a single district. If AG Nessel puts a limit on the law, it may end up in court as may the Minimum Wage and Paid Sick Days proposals passed by voters that also were gutted by the legislature.

Finally, please note that our section's recent name-change from NCJW/Greater Detroit to National Council of Jewish Women, Michigan has led to efforts to expand our membership and influence throughout the state. Our first Michigan Institute is a direct result of the outreach. Based on National's Washington Institute, we are planning a two-day training and lobbying event in Lansing with National's Jody Rabhan as our trainer and several speakers TBA who will discuss important issues. We will be meeting and staying at the Radisson Hotel on Monday, May 20, and lobbying our legislators on Tuesday, May 21. Details are still being finalized, and will be sent out shortly. Many thanks to the Jewish Women's Foundation for awarding a grant that will allow us to offer the Institute for a very reasonable participant fee. We welcome you to join us at this momentous occasion.




