Each child will be accompanied by a personal shopper and will pick out all items themselves...a shopping experience they will never forget! Additionally, new this year, we are proud to announce that we are also offering vision screening.

While the children are shopping, their parents and guardians will be invited to visit the Family Center where five of our agencies will provide program material explaining the services they offer. Legal Aid is returning, as is the Health Fair sponsored by the Jewish Community Relations Council/AJC, offering medical screenings as well as other health-related information.

There are many volunteer opportunities, such as setup and tear down, or if you prefer to be one of the 300 volunteers needed to work on the day of the store, you can be a Personal Shopper, work in the Volunteer Room, Family Center, or at Volunteer Registration, just to name a few. I also want to thank Susan Gertner, our Executive Director, for working so well with this new normal for the past year. We tried something new. May 16th was our Annual Installation and we installed as Vice Presidents, Susie Jacob, and Susan Rollinger for their 3rd, and 2nd terms respectively. spent two days in Lansing at our first Michigan Institute. We had advocacy training by Jody Rabhan, the NCJW, Inc. Washington Operations Director on the first day and on the second day, we divided up and visited the offices of 12 state representatives and 6 state senators to present our stances on legislation involving anti-gun violence, reproductive justice, and equal pay. Susan Gertner developed this idea when we changed our name and focus to National Council of Jewish Women, Michigan a year and a half ago in an effort to reach out to other Jewish communities in the state to make our voices heard. Cathy Cantor and Irma Glaser, our SPAs (State Policy Advocates) and their hard working committee put this program together. The details were staggering and it could not have gone smoother. Kudos to all who helped plan and participate. For some, it was a first exposure to advocacy; for others, it was a reenergizing experience. We all walked away feeling that we must continue to make our voices heard!

This program came a month after 15 of us traveled to Washington D.C. for our national meeting, Washington Institute. There, as well, we discussed the issues significant to NCJW and then we met with Senators Peters and Stabenow as well as Congressional members or their administrative aides, Brenda Lawrence, Rashida Tlaib, Haley Stevens, Elissa Slotkin, Andy Levin, and left NCJW literature for Congresswoman Debbie Dingell.

STATE POLICY ADVOCATES

On May 20th and 21st National Council of Jewish Women, Michigan held its first "Michigan Institute," a public policy conference that began with advocacy training and concluded with lobbying our legislators on three specific issues that affect women, children, and families. NCJW | MI received a grant from the Jewish Women's Foundation that enabled us to have Michigan Institute.

Jody Rabhan, the Director of Government Relations and Advocacy from our National NCJW office in Washington DC, led our advocacy training. Jody discussed what advocacy is and why it is so important that each of us realizes we can be advocates. We learned how to communicate effectively with our legislators and how to use other tools to advocate.

The three issues of focus for our Institute were: the Extreme Risk Protection Order gun bills ("ERPO", sometimes referred to as "Red Flag" laws); the bills repealing the 1931 abortion ban laws; and the Equal Pay bills.

Our issue education began with Representative Robert Wittenberg, who introduced several of the ERPO bills and is an ardent proponent of sensible gun legislation. Linda Brundage, founder of the Michigan Coalition to Prevent Gun Violence, was also a presenter and gave us valuable statistics about gun violence in the U.S. and in Michigan. The ERPO bills would allow family members or law enforcement to petition a judge to remove firearms temporarily from an individual deemed to be a threat to him/herself or to others.

The repeal of the 1931 bills that made abortion illegal in Michigan was our second focus. If Roe v. Wade is overturned, the nearly 100 year-old laws would again govern Michigan women's reproductive healthcare. We heard from Ethan Schmitt, a Planned Parenthood regional organizer, on this issue. NCJW believes that every woman should have the right to make personal decisions about her body, her health, and her future, and that bans on abortion coverage interfere with a woman's moral autonomy. Every woman must have the right to make personal decisions based on her own religious or moral beliefs. When lawmakers enshrine one religious view into law in order to restrict

abortion access, it erodes our nation's basic principle of religious freedom.

Our third issue was Equal Pay. We heard from Mary Pollack, Legislative Director of the Michigan section of the American Association of University Women (AAUW). Mary spoke on the history of pay inequity for women in the

workforce. The bills, which would legislate equal pay for equivalent work, have been introduced each session of the legislature for many sessions. Now, in 2019, it is time to pass legislation that assures our daughters and granddaughters that they will receive the same pay as their male counterparts for equivalent work!

Dinner on our first day was at Shaarey Zedek Synagogue in East Lansing. Our speaker was Amelia Quilon, one of the founders of Voters Not Politicians – the successful grassroots effort that ended gerrymandering in Michigan.

Our second day consisted of small groups visiting 18 legislators, both



representatives and senators, and discussing our three issues with them. Our training and issue education had prepared us for these visits. Some legislators were already in agreement with us, some were not – but all listened and we left knowing we had opened some eyes and created space for future dialogue.

Our first Michigan Institute was invigorating, enlightening, and filled with enthusiasm. The attendees left with renewed determination to continue the work of advocacy. If you would like to become involved in this work yourself, call the office and let us know. We'd love to have you!

LITERACY OUTREACH

Commitment is the basis of success for the NCJW Literacy Outreach Program! The commitment of our many outstanding tutors, coupled with the support from NCJW | MI and the positive educational environment from teachers and staff at Coleman A. Young Elementary School (CAY), make this a win-win situation! This year, NCJW purchased new books for each of the students at holiday time. In April, funds were provided by NCJW for an author, Russell Ginns, to come to the school, and he was terrific! He visited with students in grades 3-4, and each child went home with one of his books and had a wonderful, enriching literacy experience! Each week, highly skilled and committed tutors bring a lot of talent and love to develop and reinforce their skills. Adding to this literacy experience are the

CAY teachers who are very committed and share pertinent materials and feedback to promote success. The Principal, Mrs. Scott, and the school's Master Teacher, Mrs. Melanie Wallace, are very supportive and committed to the NCJW Literacy Outreach Program and are very proud to share the children's successes. Lastly, and most important of all, are the many receptive and sweet children with whom we had an opportunity to interact this year. The children LOVE the literacy experiences with the tutors; they enjoy being in a room filled with engaging materials, books and games, and they come interested in learning. Also, each classroom eagerly awaits our volunteer monthly readers who share special reading time with them. Commitment from all the above is key to the success of the NCJW Literacy Outreach Program. However, knowing the positive impact on the children is what makes the commitment worthwhile!

Israel Affairs Committee


The Israel Affairs Committee members present an informative "Israel Minute" at each monthly Board meeting, highlighting an Israeli organization or program that is a recipient of the NCJW granting program.

These recipients exemplify NCJW's mission "to strive for social justice by improving the quality of life for women, children, and families and by safeguarding individual rights and freedoms."

The recipients to date have been:

Hillel (not the campus Hillel) - The Right to Choose

This project received a grant in 2017 to support Haredi single mothers and children. Presentation by Ellie Slovis.



Israel Hofsheet - Israel Be Free – works on issues involving the lack of separation between religion and State in Israel. The project, Strengthening Equal Rights in Israel by Promoting Marriage Equality, advocates for the implementation of common law marriage in Israel. Presentation by Marta Gottesman.

Women Wage Peace (WWP) - This organization has 40,000 members, and is a fast growing, volunteer driven NGO of (mostly) women active both on a grassroots level and in the Knesset, demanding a negotiated solution to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. Presentation by Trudy Weiss.

Jewish Women's Funding Network - This grant supports a two-year collaboration with the Jewish Women's Funding Network. It advocates for justice and change in labor rights and conditions in the contract employee service sector which is comprised largely of women. Presentation by Libby Sherbin.
