She served as chair of several organizations, including the Leadership Seminar for Women's Department of Jewish Federation, Seminars for Adult Jewish Enrichment sponsored by the JCC, the JCC's Young Writer's Workshop, the Lenore Marwil Jewish Film Festival and the PR committee

of Congregation Shaarey Zedek's Sisterhood Woman's World. Susan has been a board member of Shaarey Zedek's Sisterhood and the JCC. STATE POLICY ADVOCATES

2019 will be remembered as the year that Michigan's legislature passed the fewest bills since 1960. 2,135 bills were introduced, and only 150 passed. In order for legislation to be considered, it must first be recommended by a specific committee to be sent to the house or to the senate. So far in 2020, a bipartisan bill to pay college athletes has been recommended for passage, and is likely to pass. In the meantime, women have been waiting 55 years just to get a hearing in committee for Pay Equity, Equal Pay for Equal Work. Incidentally, our state representatives and senators do get equal pay!

One of the biggest challenges facing our legislature this year is still Redistricting. Although Proposal 2, striking down gerrymandering and authorizing an independent commission to draw new lines for voting districts, was passed handily last November, court challenges keep arising and losing in the Michigan Supreme Court. As for other states, the U.S. Supreme Court, by a 5-4 decision,

has ruled that it is beyond the judiciary's authority to remedy such unconstitutional gerrymandering. The majority suggested that states could solve the problem themselves by drawing less-partisan maps. Rather like letting the fox into the henhouse.

Also, in the January 12, 2020 Free Press, Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson discusses automatic voter registration, absentee voting, and cleaning up the voter rolls in partnership with local election officials as authorized by Proposal 3 passed last November. She also talks about battling misinformation about the election process, voters' rights, preventing "hacking" voters' minds with scare tactics, and other attempts to lessen their faith or their confidence in our elections. NCJW | MI's 2020 Election Committee is working on educating our community about absentee voting, and participating in voters' registration drives. We have developed a form to be distributed to college campuses in Michigan and to Michigan students who attend schools out of state. Please see page 17 if you have a high school senior or college student in your family or in your acquaintance to help to spread the word.

January 22 was the 47th anniversary of Roe v Wade which affirmed a woman's right to choose an abortion. Our National President, Sheila Katz, wrote an OpEd, published by the Religious News Service, which points out why Roe v Wade is a First Amendment Right as Freedom of Religion, and is closely associated with the separation

of religion and state. In Michigan, an indirect ballot initiative to ban an abortion procedure, dilation and evacuation, has garnered enough signatures to be checked for validity, and if validity is established, placed on the November ballot. It is possible that the legislature's majority will pass this before it reaches the ballot, and the Governor would not be able to veto this under Michigan law. There is a movement afoot to remove this legislative loophole, but it is still in effect. More troubling, the U.S. Supreme Court that can't handle redistricting, is considering eliminating Roe v Wade.

Another concern: our coalition partner, CAP, Council About Parochiaid, that supports free public education for all Michigan children has been fighting endless court cases that would allow public taxpayer money to go to private and parochial schools. CAP opposes the removal of Michigan's constitutional ban on parochiaid, or vouchers or tuition tax credit programs. Nearly two year ago, the majority of our state legislators voted 1.5 million dollars to be used for private/parochial schools. This money has been held up by courts, but more filings keep coming. If this money is approved, it will lead to more channeling of taxpayers' money away from public education. Already, our state is one of only 16 nationally that has wealthy school districts getting more funding than poorer ones. Draining money from public education is unfair and unconstitutional.

Courts really do matter as seen with Redistricting, public vs. private school funding, and Roe v Wade. WARNING: many young nominees to lifetime federal court positions are predominantly conservative and male, and are being rushed for approval by the U.S. Senate. This will lead to a judiciary unfriendly to women's issues. There is a solution though. We need to vote and to encourage others to vote in all of our upcoming elections. Together, we can make a difference.

For 70 years, NCJW has worked in partnership with Israel to support advocates, women leaders, and outreach programs. - 2005 Feminist donor circle US Israel Women to Women integrated into NCJW grassroots and advocacy support of Israeli women
- Israel, Past Achievements and Future Directions." National feminist conference in Tel Aviv, "Women Leading Change" in partnership with the Dafna Fund and with support of Mazer Family Fund.


