Our 2020 Election Committee, led by Co-State Policy Advocates, Cathy Cantor and Irma Glaser, is offering a series of 3 webinars concerning the November 2020 election. The first one, "Meet the Candidates," will feature the local winners of our state and federal primaries. They will have the opportunity to state their positions on the issues in which we are most interested. They will be encouraged to discuss their ideas on how to deal with these problems.

The next program is "Protecting the Election," with Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson, Oakland County Clerk Lisa Brown, and West Bloomfield Township Clerk, Debbie Binder. Learn about how the post office's money woes might impact the election, how mail-in ballots will be handled, how the voter who wants to cast a ballot in person on Election Day will be treated, will there be enough workers on Election Day to do the job, and other questions about the election.

Our final program will be "The Next Chapter: Post-Election Predictions." We will welcome several political pundits to predict the effects of the election on the lives of women, children, and families. Also included will be a discussion about the Electoral College and its influence on the results of the presidential choice, both past and future.

pandemic, we are streamlining everything to align with our need to "tighten our belts" during this period. Therefore, this Bulletin is a condensed report of our usual version. You will notice that all the articles and news items are abbreviated. We will continue to keep you updated on the important work that NCJW|MI is doing through eblasts and email. at the Store. Rabbi Aaron Bergman conducted a well-attended Nosh and Knowledge Zoom session dealing with art and the Jewish influence through the ages. Courts Matter was the topic of the July Zoom session of Nosh and Knowledge facilitated by Susan Marwil and Suzanne Simon. Kosher Meals on Wheels continues to provide meals to our regular clients and many more who have been affected by the pandemic. After much work adapting and aligning to the CDC and the Governor's guidelines, council re|sale is open for business and has been booming! We extend our deep appreciation and gratitude to our dedicated volunteers who have made the council relsale store opening a great success! Election 2020, NCJW Green, Human Trafficking Awareness, Israel Affairs, and Soup committees, just to mention a few, are all up and running!

Most importantly, NCJW|MI needs your support now more than ever. In order to continue our work, it is essential that we maintain our fundraising efforts. Much has changed in the world since I wrote my article for our last bulletin. I am a very social person, but I no longer want to be too close to people; I used to enjoy coming to the office to work, but I now enjoy working from home and taking a "pet my dogs" break a few times a day; instead of driving to various places for meetings, I can now attend many meetings in a day without ever leaving my home. Back in March, we had to figure out how to work remotely, do we have to close council re|sale and layoff staff, how do we ensure that older adults in our community can stay safely at home and make sure they have food to eat?

Most recently, we reopened our store and had to figure out how to keep employees, volunteers, customers, and donors safe. That enormous task was led by Susie Jacob and Sandi Matz. They

did an amazing job and we have received PODs full of donations. I can't thank Susie, Sandi and all of our volunteers and staff enough for their hard work. I also thank all of you who have donated clothing and/or shopped at our store. Your support helped us get back on our feet, and we had an amazing first month. Our office staff has worked remotely from their homes since mid-March. There is nothing we can't do from home with today's technology. Thanks to zoom, we have been able to see each other weekly at our zoom staff meetings. Our largest attended Board Meeting was also through zoom.

Though we are not a Jewish Federation supported agency, we were invited to join other Jewish communal agencies at the beginning of the pandemic crisis. We worked together, under the leadership of Steve Ingber, Jewish Federation's Chief Operating Officer, at first meeting daily, then 3 times a week, and then once a week to ensure that needed services were provided. I have never been more proud of being a Jewish communal agency leader, as I have been during these past months working with such dedicated leaders of our community. I hope by next Spring, we will be able to meet in person and invite you to save the date of Sunday, March 14th for our Spring fundraiser; the Detroit Youth Choir will perform for us in support of our youth programs. For now, I hope you and your loved ones remain safe and healthy as we maneuver our way through this new norm.





council re|sale opened its doors to customers on Monday, July 6, after being closed for almost 4 months due to COVID-19. Customers were lined up for an hour before the opening, waiting to be the first to take advantage of our 50% Off Everything Sale and to shop the \$1 racks of women's blouses and men's shirts. Adhering to the CDC Guidelines, the number of customers in the store at one time was limited, creating a line outside the store throughout most the day. Once customers entered the store, however, they were welcomed with great excitement, along with virtual hugs and kisses all around! It was a wonderful and happy reunion!

None of this could have happened without the help of our incredible re|sale volunteers. First, many thanks to the re|sale team, consisting of 16 amazing women, who met several times a week by Zoom for weeks, and put together and executed a plan of action for the reopening. Then, once the store was fogged and cleaned, the amazing re|sale staff, especially our store manager, Delores, along with several dozen volunteers (many who came several times a week!), hit the ground running to prepare the store for its big day. Donations were accepted in two PODs in the parking lot before the store opened and were quarantined before they were put on the floor to sell. Our workers sorted, hung, organized, and arranged the merchandise so that when the doors finally opened on July 6, everything looked spotless and beautiful! We want everyone on the re|sale team and all our staff and volunteers to know how much we value your help and devotion. You all did an incredible job and we thank you for your time, effort, and loyalty.

So now that the store is open, our hours are Monday through Saturday, 10AM - 6PM. **Donations are collected curbside Thursday** through Saturday, 10AM - 4PM.

We still need volunteers to help keep up with the constant influx of donations and to help take care of customers in the store. HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Human Trafficking is often called modern day slavery. It occurs in every country in the world, including the United States – even your community. Trafficking knows no boundaries such as socio-economic status, gender, ethnicity, or age. It is often referred to as a crime occurring in plain sight.

The goal of the Human Trafficking Awareness Committee is to provide awareness and education to the public with substantiated evidence and reputable facts, through presentations provided by well-respected experts in the field.

Even during a pandemic, Human Trafficking does not go away. Rather, it has been determined that due to the quarantine, victims may be further abused – with no way to report, no way to escape, no teacher/friend/neighbor to keep a watchful eye, and with limited access to health care facilities, safe homes needing to maintain distance and quarantine for their residents, nobody to monitor any labor trafficking violations, borders closed...the list goes on and on.

Yes, Human Trafficking is still occurring – even in this pandemic.

The Human Trafficking Awareness Committee continues to educate ourselves as we continue to plan our next program (tentatively scheduled for spring 2021). We know that we can't help others if we aren't aware of current trends and resources.

In addition, the Committee will be reaching out to different homes and facilities that provide refuge, housing, and restorative environments for the vulnerable population. This can include survivors of Human Trafficking, Domestic Violence, etc. We will assess their need for face masks, with the goal to provide bright, cheerful, and colorful masks. Many survivors have voiced their fear of seeing face masks and wearing face masks. For them it is often a PTSD trigger, recalling an abuser or trafficker who wore a black mask. We want to offer an alternative, one that conveys love, hope, and safety. We will be relying on NCJW | MI members to sew and donate the masks.

The Kosher Meals on Wheels program has grown significantly during the COVID-19 pandemic. The number of clients served has increased from approximately 60 to 150 daily participants. This increase was most dramatic during the months of March and April. Special funding was received through Area Agency on Aging 1B, Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Detroit, and United Way for Southeastern Michigan.

With the exponential growth of the program, we required many more volunteers. Jewish Family Service through their volunteer services, aided us enormously. They performed the background checks and the volunteers were ready to step in when and where they were needed. We are sorry to say that Frank Lanzkron-Tamarazo has left the position as Coordinator of the Kosher Meals on Wheels Program. Executive Director of NCJW | MI, Susan Gertner stepped in to make sure that the program ran smoothly and that we had a smooth transition to a new coordinator.

We thank all of our volunteers for their commitment to the program. They label and pack 150 bags per day and make sure our recipients receive the meals that they need. Special thanks to Carrie Kushner, Marilynn Sabin, Ellie Slovis, Randie Levin, Sallyjo Levine, Judy Robinson, and Donna Pearlman for their invaluable daily assistance. We are enormously grateful for the commitment, dedication, and enthusiasm of all of our volunteers. Without them, this program would not be possible.

At the beginning of 2020 COVID-19 descended upon us causing most activities to cease by early spring, among them Wrapped in Love. No one was meeting in the NCJW office and online Zoom meetings quickly became the norm.

By mid-May NCJW|MI received a request from one of the organizations to whom we supply blankets. Without missing a beat, co-chair Sandy Collins contacted Sandy Oleinick to request that she cut some blankets. At home, Sandy Oleinick cut eighteen blankets and Sandy Collins distributed them to several women to tie. Those would be the first eighteen blankets to go to children and families since COVID-19 hit. Eighteen, chai, to help sustain life for those in need by providing comfort and security during the pandemic.

As we generally provide fifty blankets to agencies when they are in need, we knew we had to get into the office to check our supply of cut and tied blankets. Within just a few days, our "regulars" were meeting in the NCJW parking lot to each pick up a bag of cut blankets to tie. While keeping social distancing we have managed to keep up with the demand for blankets, and with the aid of technology (bi-monthly Zoom meetings) we continue to "see" each other and tie blankets "together."

Without a doubt, the women in our section will always work around any obstacles to ensure that we achieve our goals to help women, children, and families!






