

The mission of Plastic Bags Make Plastic Mats (PBPM), an NCJW | MI Green sub-committee, is to recycle used grocerystyle plastic bags and turn them into sleeping mats for the homeless. These


mats provide a dry and easily cleaned and comfortable sleeping surface. At the same time, they offer a partial solution to the destruction of our environment, wildlife, and our own health from the plastic fossil fuel industry by reusing 700-800 plastic bags per mat.

This dedicated group of women took on the challenge of increasing the

youth vote in the 2020 election. Even when the pandemic caused everyone to retreat to the safety of our homes, the Committee pivoted and launched a "safe" campaign to get out the youth vote with the "Let's Both Vote" campaign. This campaign offered a way that each NCJW member could effectively reach out to her young relatives and friends with updated information necessary to register to vote and sign up for no-reason absentee voting. This innovative and successful campaign was picked up by other Jewish organizations, synagogues, and churches.

The Committee created three outstanding webinars as part of its "The Power of Your Vote" series, as well as putting together questionnaires for State House candidates in 13 districts and the US Senate candidates, and posting the questionnaires received from the candidates on the NCJW | MI website. The Committee was due to end its "charge" on Dec 31, 2020. But, even before January 6th, the Committee members felt there was still much to be done. So instead of ending, the Committee expanded!

Now, the newly named "Advocacy and Elections Committee" will continue to work on fair and free elections, focusing on ending voter suppression, and making voting accessible, safe and secure. In addition, the Committee has decided to focus on issues of importance to NCJW: including reproductive justice, gun violence prevention, equal pay, public education, immigration, civil rights with focus on anti-semitism and racism, and federal courts. All issues that are critical in terms of elections.

This Committee has just started working under its new charge, and already has put together its first action: a series of webinars called "Hate is Hate . . . Who is at Risk?" The first of the series was on March 31st and featured Andrew Lapin, Associate Editor at the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, discussing Father Coughlin, Shrine of the Little Flower founder and radio personality who used his media presence to incite a nation into violence and anti-semitism. If you missed it, visit our website to watch a recording of this excellent program. Upcoming topics include anti-semitism today, anti-Semitism and racism, anti-semitism and the Women's Movement, and Misinformation, Disinformation and Lies - Examining Conspiracy Theories and the Media, among others.
