Providing those Experiencing Homelessness a Comfortable Sleeping Mat

Plastic Bags Make Plastic Mats (PBPM) is an NCJW | MI Green subcommittee, committed to making sleeping mats from plastic bags for those experiencing homelessness. These mats provide a dry, easily cleaned and comfortable sleeping surface. At the same time, they offer a partial solution to the plastic pollution problem.

How Can You Participate?

It's simple. There are multiple ways to get involved:

- BAG COLLECTION
 - Collect used clean, plastic bags (straighten them if you can) and drop them off in the main lobby of the NCJW | MI office building*; **or**
- MAKE PLARN – *see instructions and video below*
 - Volunteer to make yarn out of the bags (“plarn”) by cutting the bags into strips and rolling into balls (If you don’t plan on doing the mats, you can drop the plarn off in the main lobby of the NCJW | MI office building*; **or**
- KNIT/CROCHET THE MATS – *see instructions and video below*
 - For those who love to knit or crochet, you can use your skills to make the mats (you can drop finished mats off or call the NCJW | MI office* to arrange for pickup); **or**
- DO IT ALL
 - Take on the entire process and create your own artistic vision of these beautiful mats! Drop off finished mats in the main lobby of the NCJW | MI office building*.

- According to the EPA about 500 billion to 1 trillion plastic bags are produced each year worldwide requiring billions of pounds of fossil fuels and billions of gallons of fresh water.
- What we get in return is billions of pounds of solid waste as well as millions of tons of CO2 released into the atmosphere each year.
- Improper disposal of these bags, which never completely break-down, increases the risk of severe flooding by clogging storm drains and other sources where water accumulates.
- These bags pollute the oceans and shorelines and cause the death of hundreds of thousands of avian and marine wildlife per year.
