meetings. Others boldly ventured out with masks and social distancing to continue their work on a particular project. Whatever the preference was, committee work for NCJW | MI continued at a record pace! The spirit of the women of NCJW both here in Michigan and nationally will not be deterred! Our website (ncjwmi.org) gives a clear picture of who we are and what we do:

We Advocate and take action on social justice issues at the local, state, and federal levels.

We Participate in meeting community needs through our service projects for children and adults.

We Educate by offering issue based speakers, discussions, and cultural arts programs.

Although we have adjusted our means of involvement, we remain dedicated to our mission. Here are just some of the committees that have fully functioned during the pandemic year.

- Advocacy/Election Reached out to young people and the general population to assure a tremendous voter turnout in the November 2020 election.
- Back 2 School Store & Wrapped in Warmth - Distributed clothing items to 500 Detroit children.

- Backpack Project Provided backpacks filled with school supplies to homeless children in Oakland County as well as lewish children in need.
- Council re|sale Donations and purchases helped support and sustain our community service projects.
- Kosher Meals on Wheels -Volunteers packed and delivered meals to the homebound in cooperation with Jewish Family Service. This was especially important during the COVID crisis which doubled our clientele.
- Wrapped in Love Created fleece blankets for children removed from their homes and placed in foster care, and for children or adults receiving medical treatment in the hospital.

Of course, Nosh & Knowledge and Advocacy programs filled the calendar, from Rabbi Bergman of Adat Shalom Synagogue discussing the Music of Leonard Cohen to the NCJW Green committee advocating and educating the public on the world-wide initiative to end single-use plastics. The women of NCJW | MI are stronger and more committed than ever! I salute my fellow travelers on this road of dedication and passion.

The new year begins at sundown on Monday, September 6. Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement begins at sundown on Wednesday, September 15. As we participate in the Yizkor (memorial) service, we can all make a pledge to honor the dead by taking care of the living.

Summer is here and there is hope in the air. Our office opened on July 12th, and our staff as well as committee meetings are back to work. We are working on how we can continue zoom and in person meetings and programs. We will keep you updated as we move along. I want to thank our staff

for the past 16 months of transitioning to work remotely. Yes, there were some snags along the way, but we did it. The year could not have gone as smoothly without them. And thank you to our Board of Directors and volunteers who learned how to master zoom meetings and accomplish so much virtually this past year. Together we did it and I am proud of us. During the pandemic, we served more than twice the number of kosher meals on wheels per day, providing over 60,000 meals in the past 16 months, we had a greater number of people attend each of our virtual programs, we made calls to connect to each of our members, we worked towards increasing voter turnout, and the list goes on. The pandemic did not stop us from connecting with others and continuing to make a difference with our community service projects.

RABBI MARLA HORNSTEN, TEMPLE ISRAEL

Rabbi Marla has been affiliated with Temple Israel for 21 years. Throughout her tenure, she has been passionate about working with women as an advocate for equality, studying women in text, and creating a variety of women's programming including a monthly Rosh Chodesh women's spirituality group. Rabbi Marla's passion extends to involvement in domestic abuse awareness; locally, nationally, and internationally, while serving on various

boards and coalitions including past co-chair of the Jewish Women International's Clergy Task Force Against Domestic Violence. She is co-chair of the Coalition for Black and Jewish Unity, serving on the Board of Directors at Jewish Family Service and the Henry Ford Hospital in West Bloomfield. Rabbi Marla has been on the board of the Women's Rabbinic Network and a past-president of the Michigan Board of Rabbis. Her rabbinic thesis, Claiming Hagar: A Search for Identity in Rabbinic Midrash, combines Rabbi Marla's love of text and her commitment to women and women's identity.


STATE POLICY ADVOCATES

We have been joyous to experience the reopening of our country and communities, and seeing our friends' unmasked faces.

But recent events have also unmasked ugliness. The rise in antisemitism meant that we again had to react quickly and take action. We partnered with JCRC/AJC, Hadassah, ZOA, and ADL to host the "Stand Up to Antisemitism" rally on June 6, 2021. We worked with the Israel Affairs Committee and crafted a letter to the President and Board of Governors of Wayne State University in response to WSU Student Senate's Palestine Resolution, to encourage their strong vocal support against antisemitism on campus. We created the NCJW|MI Antisemitism Position Statement (see below), and we are creating a webinar to address the emotional toll that antisemitism takes on school children and their parents, college students, and older adults.



With draconian bills being introduced to limit abortion access and freedoms, the fight for reproductive freedom, rights and justice must also stay front and center.

With antisemitism increasing at an alarming rate locally, nationally, and globally, the National Council of Jewish Women State Policy Advocates for Michigan and NCJW | MI Board of Directors felt it important to create an Antisemitism Position Statement for our Michigan Section. This statement is based on the National NCJW Statement.

National Council of Jewish Women, Michigan Antisemitism Position Statement

For 130 years, National Council of Jewish Women, Michigan (NCJW | MI) has been fighting toxic structures of systemic hate on behalf of people of many different racial, ethnic, national, and cultural backgrounds. We've responded as allies in coalitions, and through writing and lobbying for legislation to move toward a more understanding and inclusive world.

NCJW has defined antisemitism as a form of oppression that is hostile toward Jewish people. It is systemic oppression that takes many forms, such as stereotypes and myths about Jews, false conspiracy theories, Holocaust denial, religious intolerance, overt discrimination, physical violence, destruction of Jewish communal spaces and monuments, blaming societal problems on the Jewish people, and holding individual Jewish people accountable for governmental affairs, domestic or foreign.

Antisemitism has become more visible and emboldened in the past several years, showing up in spaces where we work nationally and in our local communities. It is critical that NCJW | MI speak out and stand up for our own Jewish community, and fight just as hard against this form of hate as we do for other forms. It is important to create safety for our own communities, and because we know that fighting one form of hate is linked to the fight for all forms.

Antisemitism must be eradicated in all its forms, no matter what the source. The current crisis in Israel has exacerbated antisemitic rhetoric and attacks on Jewish people across the world. Criticism of Israel is sometimes weaponized as a cover for antisemitic beliefs and actions. While it is valid to criticize the politics in the region, questioning the right of Israel to exist and holding all Jews accountable for Israel's policies is antisemitic. Commentary on Israel that casts Zionism as illegitimate enables an environment of hateful action.

NCJW | MI is committed to standing up and speaking out against all forms of hate, including antisemitism. It is imperative to call out antisemitism when we witness it. We encourage anyone who sees antisemitic rhetoric or actions to contact the ADL at www.adl.org/reportincident and also report the antisemitism directly to the platform where it is posted.





NCJW|MI **BACKPACK PROJECT**

The NCJW | MI Backpack project is back once again in a modified version. We are delivering backpacks filled with school supplies directly to Oakland Schools and Jewish Family Service.

Thanks to the Claire and Arthur (z'l) Kretchmer Backpack Project Fund and the Carol Krugel Backpack Project Fund as well as grants from the DeRoy Testamentary Foundation and the Phillip & Elizabeth Filmer Memorial Charitable Trust, 450 filled backpacks will go to Jewish Family Service for Jewish students in need and 900 backpacks to the Oakland Schools Homeless Student Education Program.

BACK 2 SCHOOL Store a project of NCJW[M]

You may ask what is happening with the NCJW | MI Back 2 School Store for August 2021...

With the advent of COVID-19, the in-person experience was not possible for the summer of 2020. But the need for the children was still there! Coats, hats, mittens, and socks were purchased and distributed to our partner agencies so that 500 children would receive the items.

In addition to our summer Back 2 School Store (B2SS), this past January "The Wrapped in Warmth" project was created. With the cooperation of 18 social service agencies, 315 Detroit youth were provided with coats, socks, mittens, pajama bottoms, masks, and toothbrushes.

With COVID-19 still of concern, our Back to School Store for this upcoming August will once again be modified. We will be increasing the number of children served to 900 and distribute the clothing through our partner agencies. This year, we will add new books to the bags of clothing.

We thank those of you who have volunteered or made a donation in the past and we hope August 2022 will bring back our traditional Back 2 School Store.

Though we are not holding our Back 2 School Store Annual Donation Campaign, we invite you to purchase B2SS tribute cards throughout the year or make a donation when you are able, to help support our B2SS 2021.
