

STATE POLICY ADVOCATES

NCJW \mid MI advocacy work is never done, but we often hope for times when we can relax our vigilance. This year has not afforded us that luxury.

As 2021 nears its conclusion, the Advocacy and Elections Committee will once again take up its efforts to get out the vote – this time for the important midterm elections. And they are important. Traditionally, midterm elections experience a large drop in voter turnout. But the issues facing our state and nation show that every election, for every level of government, is important. It is our task to educate our voters on that point, to get people registered to vote, to assist voters in making the decisions that reflect their values, and to give voters the information they need to vote safely, be it by mail or in person.

Advocacy requires work on two fronts: State and Federal. We will continue to encourage Congress to pass the For the People Act and the John Lewis Voting Rights Act to secure free access to the ballot box. Simultaneously, we will continue to urge the Michigan legislature to deny passage of the 39 bills introduced this year to make voting difficult in our state. At the time of writing this article, several of those bills have passed the Michigan Senate and House and are awaiting final coordination and approval before submission to the Governor, who has indicated she will veto them.

But there is a loophole in the Michigan constitution that affords a way to make a law veto-proof by the Governor, and those who have supported voting laws that make the process more difficult

have been open and vocal about utilizing this loophole. In Michigan, it is possible for a citizen or organization to file to launch a petition drive to get legislation on the ballot for Michigan voters to approve or disapprove in the next election. The number of signatures required to get on the ballot is 8% of the total votes in the previous gubernatorial election, in this particular case, only 340,047 signatures would be needed. That is about 3.4% of Michigan's population. After the appropriate number of signatures have been gathered and approved, the loophole allows the legislature 40 days in which to decide whether to vote the ballot language into law themselves – thereby denying Michigan voters the right to make that choice on election day. A law passed by this method is veto-proof by the Governor.

The loophole strategy has now been implemented. "Secure MI Vote" launched a petition drive for laws that will make it harder to vote. Should the requisite number of signatures be collected, the legislature has the majority to, and has indicated it will, pass the petition and make it law, which would be veto-proof by the Governor. This would override the majority of Michiganders who voted in 2018 to pass Proposal 3, which eased access to the ballot box. If confronted by someone seeking your signature on a petition in the name of "secure elections," it is important to "DECLINE TO SIGN," and to pass the word along to everyone you know to do the same. These petitions are designed to make it harder for us to vote.

In addition to voting matters, issues of particular importance and with greatest consequences to women are again front and center, and require advocacy on both the Federal and State levels. Reproductive freedom is at risk, and the need to address the security of the right to choose is urgent. The Supreme Court's decision to take the Mississippi case that bans abortion after 15 weeks is concerning, as is the passage of Texas's draconian SB8 law. These have galvanized advocates of choice around the country, but we need to add our voices. On a state level, the urgency to rescind the 1931 Michigan law that would ban abortion cannot be overstated with the threat that Roe v Wade could be gutted by the Supreme Court.

Our voices are important. When you receive an Action Alert from NCJW|MI, please take the action requested and make YOUR voice heard. As always, the Advocacy and Elections Committee welcomes your participation on taking action and in joining our team as we work to keep our freedoms as Women and as Americans.

BACK, 2 SCHOOL Store a project of NCJW [M]

The Back to School Store 2021 was a huge success. We had more than fifty "masked" NCJW | MI volunteers from our board of directors and steering committee, spanning over four days (August 9-12) at Hope of Detroit Academy. We provided clothing for 900 children from twenty-one social service agencies. For each child we packed a winter jacket, mittens

(donated by Mittens for Detroit), a hat, underwear, two pairs of socks (donated from Bombas and Hanes), a sweatshirt, athletic pants for the boys and leggings for the girls. Each child received a toothbrush and toothpaste (donated by U of M Dental School). Each agency received two books per child, (donated by Sallyjo Levine and the Oppenheim Literacy Fund). Volunteers made bookmarks and cards for each child. The Ford Foundation donated masks that were also included.

The "College Hunks Moving Company" was amazing! They brought from and returned unused items to our storage unit.

Even in a Pandemic, NCJW | MI was able to provide for 900 children in need with a little warmth for the winter and books to read.

Educational Assistance Committee

The William Davidson Jewish College Loan Program, administered through the Hebrew Free Loan Education Assistance met in July and September to review student's applications for their annual interest-free loan allocations. The committee granted \$545,000 of interest-free loans to 72 students in July, as well as \$444,800 to 59 students in September. This includes both undergraduate and graduate students, some for the first time and some returning for another year's interest-free loan.

The 2021 William Davidson Jewish College Loan Program total allocation is \$989,800 to 131 students. This includes NCJW | MI's contribution of \$100,000 and \$20,000 from the Maimonides Fund.

NCJW | MI looks forward to our continued participation in this very important service to the community.




