of my favorite things is to know that we begin anew. We have the choice to stay our path or seek new directions.

Last bulletin I spoke about footprints. I mentioned that when we leave a footprint we leave a memory of where we have been. This Bulletin I will speak of the heart. National Council of Jewish Women, Michigan has a huge heart. We are always willing to go the distance to make the world a better, safer, and more equitable place. Our programs and projects show the commitment that we have made. We recognize that we have work to do and we seem to go and do it. Our enthusiasm is contagious. In no other organization that I have been involved with does someone say, "I need" and immediately there is a chorus of "I can help."

Our Monday mornings at the office are filled with ladies who weekly make blankets to donate to children in need. There is camaraderie working together and chatting while they create beautiful blankets. We will be working with Pepper Elementary School in Oak Park, both tutoring and reading to classes. The venue has changed but the commitment has not. Our Kosher Meals on Wheels program

is second to none. More than 100 seniors in our community are assisted with needed meals. The volunteers take this on as a call to action.

We just finished two successful programs. The Backpack Project put filled backpacks in the hands of hundreds of school children, distributed through Jewish Family Service and Oakland Schools. Our Back 2 School Store, although without the personal shopping experience, gave 900 Detroit school children a start on a successful year. The agencies that we worked with were very grateful.

After having to cancel twice, we finally were able to have the Detroit Youth Choir entertain us for a wonderful afternoon of music and amazing kids. Our connections grow, the more we reach out to the community. We offer programs that are open to the community, music, video, Jewish Youth Awards, and lectures on a myriad of topics.

Our State Policy Advocates work tirelessly to keep us up to date on what is happening, locally, state-wide, and nationally. There are no avenues that they do not pursue to make sure that we are headed in the right direction. I cannot imagine how other sections can function without having such dedicated women. Their hearts are in the right place and we are grateful.

Be proud of our section. Each of these programs and projects are led by women who have big hearts, a willingness to pursue change, and a commitment to "Tikkun olam," repairing the world.

Human Trafficking Awareness

Human Trafficking occurs in every area of the world and knows no boundaries including socioeconomic, gender, ethnicity, or age. The Human Trafficking Awareness Committee works to educate NCJW|MI members as well as the community at large on Human Trafficking. This is accomplished by offering programing, webinars, and eblasts. Participants can be confident that all educational programs and speakers are vetted to ascertain that evidence-based and substantiated data will be presented without the use of sensationalism.

Some of the areas we are exploring to present are training people in service industries such as hotels, airlines, and truck drivers, to recognize trafficking situations and what to do. We are looking into Human Trafficking educational gaps in our school systems, for both students and educators. We also are looking to share the stories of survivors; some within our own community.

Courts Matter

Yes, our Courts Matter. That is why our NCJW Michigan Courts Matter Coalition sends a United States Senate weekly courts wrap-up to Coalition members and to those NCJW | MI members who have subscribed to receive Action Alerts.

For decades, conservatives and right-wing organizations have understood the importance and power of the courts. They

educated their constituents and elevated the issue in the minds of voters so that when they went to vote for President or US Senator, they considered what kinds of judges would these leaders nominate and confirm. The rest of us focused on the issues we cared about but mainly ignored the issue of the courts-what kind of judges will sit in lifetime seats and make decisions on these issues. Make no mistake—when voting for a president who nominates judges and senators who confirm all the nominees regardless of the state where their court resides—we must keep this issue high on our priority list!



Courts Matter Michigan is a non-partisan coalition of diverse organizations united in their efforts to ensure a well-functioning federal judiciary composed of qualified judges who are committed to upholding our core constitutional values, such as equality, freedom, and justice for all.

Therefore, the upcoming Midterm election in November is so vital. We are excited to announce the availability of Courts Matter to Voting Rights. The purpose of this program is to increase awareness and understanding of the fundamental right to vote and how it relates to our judicial system. We are providing materials about voting rights and the federal courts to encourage people to exercise their right to vote.

The materials are provided free of charge and include a PowerPoint slideshow, script, facilitation guide for the presenter, and accompanying handouts. If you know of a group of young adults or others who would like to use this presentation, please contact us.

Voting in this Midterm Election and the 2024 Presidential Election is so vital in preserving our voting rights and democracy. We hope that those who participate in this presentation will be better informed and vote.

Additionally, judges confirmed to lifetime seats on federal courts continue to have the power to impact almost every aspect of public policy. Daily, they make decisions about our health care, body autonomy, voting rights, the environment, law enforcement, and civil rights. That is why Courts Matter.

NOVEMBER 8, 2022. VOTE! VOTE LIKE YOUR LIFE DEPENDS ON IT. IT DOES. VOTE LIKE THE LIVES OF YOUR KIDS AND GRANDKIDS DEPEND ON IT. THEY DO. VOTE LIKE THE LIVES OF YOUR NIECES, NEPHEWS, NEIGHBORS DEPEND ON IT. THEY DO.

The midterm elections are on Tuesday, November 8th. Polls are open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. If you have not voted by absentee ballot, make a plan to vote at the polls. Participate in our *Let's Both Vote* campaign to be sure that the young people in your lives have voted or have a plan to vote on Election Day.

What is at stake:

1. Reproductive Decision-Making. The ballot proposal Reproductive Freedom for All would provide for a Michigan constitutional right to reproductive freedom. The term reproductive freedom would be defined as "the right to make and effectuate decisions about all matters relating to pregnancy, including but

not limited to prenatal care, childbirth, postpartum care, contraception, sterilization, abortion care, miscarriage management, and infertility care." One could not be prosecuted for seeking, having, or providing an abortion.

National Council of Jewish Women, Michigan encourages and supports this ballot proposal. Vote "Yes" on Reproductive Freedom for All.

2. **Voting Rights:** The ballot proposal **Promote the Vote 2022** would provide for a change to the Michigan Constitution with goals to make our elections more secure, modern, and accessible.

The proposal prohibits intimidation or interference of voters, provides for more drop boxes and absentee ballot postage, allows for 9 days of early in-person voting, allows for absentee ballots to be mailed to registered voters by submitting an absentee ballot application covering all future elections (eliminating the need to request it every election), ensures election results are determined solely by voters, allows voters to track their absentee ballots to be confident their votes are counted, and allows for military personnel who move often and serve overseas to have their votes counted as long as their ballots are received no later than six days after Election

Day.

National Council of Jewish Women, Michigan encourages and supports this ballot proposal. Vote "Yes" on Promote the Vote 2022.

Our Section has worked hard to circulate and gather and record signatures on these petitions to successfully get them on the ballot to ensure our rights as citizens of Michigan and the United States. Vote – and encourage others to do so, also.




