The William Davidson Jewish College Loan Program (WDJCLP) provides interest-free loans to Jewish students from across Michigan for post-secondary study at accredited institutions. WDJCLP's loans are meant to help cover the difference between a student's total expenses for the school year and their financial resources for paying them, including Federal student loans and expected family contribution. Applicants must be enrolled full-time in a program at a college, university or graduate school that leads to a degree. NCJW | MI Education Assistance donors support the Loan Program by annually funding loans.

## **State Policy Advocates**

The lesson of the midterm elections of 2022 was significant. With access to abortion and the a bdication of healthcare rights concerning pregnancy on the line, grassroots efforts led to the clear victory of the passage of Proposal 3: Reproductive Freedom for All. With accessible, intimidation-free voting under threat, grassroots work led to the decisive passage of Proposal 2: Promote the Vote 2022.

The outline for success worked. It entailed educating ourselves on the issues to become knowledgeable participants in canvassing, presenting programs, and educating the community. It meant finding others with whom we could partner in these endeavors, and to build relationships



that would only strengthen through

the months of work. It led to finding various avenues of advocacy so that everyone could participate at their comfort level: writing letters, calling or texting legislators, canvassing, testifying before the Board of State Canvassers, joining a rally, and talking with family, friends, and affinity groups. Now, we are using these tools and lessons to focus on Gun Violence Prevention, Climate Change, Antisemitism, and codifying a nationwide right to reproductive healthcare, including safe and legal abortion.

Our Advocacy and Elections Committee also continues to work on equal pay and education issues. We recognize that the political and social climate is a constantly shifting landscape. We invite you to bring your concerns and/or suggestions for advocacy to us. We, along with Cathy Cantor, co-chair of the Advocacy and Elections Committee, will host "What's on Your Mind?" sessions in order to listen to what issues are important to you. The dates and times for the upcoming months are listed at right. We look forward to hearing your thoughts!

#### Israel Affairs

NCJW's Israel Granting Program seeks to improve the lives of women, children, and families throughout Israel. The organizations and projects we fund advance women's empowerment and gender equality.

This year NCJW | MI Israel Affairs Committee chose to award our share of the grant monies to Physicians for Human Rights. The agency was awarded a grant in 2022 to provide sexual health and reproductive care to women without permanent legal status in the Tel Aviv/Yafo area, including prenatal care, birth control, gynecological care, abortion, and support groups for pregnancy loss, and fertility challenges.

Approximately 200,000 people live in Israel without legal status. Although some of these populations are protected from expulsion, many live in Israel with very limited access to basic public services, including healthcare. Among these marginalized communities, women are especially exposed to mistreatment and neglect.
