I am often asked about what is going on at NCJW|MI. The short answer is, "LOTS." We never lost our footing during COVID and we seem to always be looking forward. Our office is starting to hold in-person meetings and programs and it seems that our women are just

delighted to be able to come back. The antidote to loneliness is socialization and we invite you to join us.

Our Monday mornings are spent with women creating blankets for Wrapped In Love. They are a dedicated group that even worked when the office was closed. If you could hear the quiet hum of these ladies you would be so proud of their commitment. The blankets are distributed to hospitals, safe homes for children that are removed from their homes, and to Jay Towers who gives them to children who are ill.

Our upcoming events mean that we are hard at work planning, purchasing, and organizing. Our Back 2 School Store, although not in person this year, will be supplying clothes, toiletries, and school supplies to 900 Detroit school children. There will be opportunities for you to volunteer closer to the summer event.

We continue to supply backpacks to Oakland County children, read and tutor in Oak Park at Pepper Elementary School, offer video and essay contests to teens and still work with adult and child guardianship cases.

Our spring fundraiser will be the play, "The Vagina Monologues." At the play we will be collecting female personal hygiene products to donate. How lucky are we that this is not a problem that we face, but are able to help those in need? How sad that something we take for granted is so out of reach for so many girls and women.

This year we celebrate the 20th anniversary of the All Kids Playground. It was the brainchild of NCJW and offers a barrier-free playground, so all children, regardless of their ability level, can enjoy a day of fun. We are also celebrating the 75th birthday of the state of Israel. There will be community events but we will offer some special programming of our own.

Each year in the fall we highlight Fall Focus, as well as Women of Vision. We have begun to work on these programs and are always open to new involvement. In NCJW we learn from our past, but we plan for our future. "Because we have always done it this way" should not be in our vocabulary. Let's move forward with new ideas, new enthusiasm, and new participants.

Jewish College Loan Program

Since 1902 NCJW|MI has helped to provide funds for educational loans and grants. Today the William Davidson Jewish College Loan Program (WDJCLP) provides interest-free loans to Jewish students from across Michigan for post-secondary study at accredited institutions. WDJCLP's loans are meant to help cover the difference between a student's total expenses for the school year and their financial resources for paying them, including Federal student loans and expected family contribution. Applicants must be enrolled full-time in a program at a college, university, or graduate school that leads to a degree. NCJW | MI Education Assistance donors support the Loan Program by annually funding loans.

State Policy Advocates

One of the more difficult tasks that the SPAs are asked to do is write Bulletin articles when the topics being addressed are fluid and changing. Articles due weeks before the issue will land in members' mailboxes, and risk publishing information that may be outdated when received. Yet, sometimes that is actually what one would hope for: that the legislation that we strive to pass has passed without our continued calls to action.

GUN VIOLENCE PREVENTION

One year ago, at the time of the Oxford shooting, the SPAs reported that firearms were the secondleading cause of death in children and teens. This year, just prior to the mass shooting at Michigan State University, firearm death was elevated to THE leading cause of death in children and teens.

With the turnover of political leadership in the Michigan Senate and Michigan House of Representatives, Michigan Democrats pledged to advance gun violence prevention legislation.

The Michigan Senate rolled out gun reform, including long-standing priorities of universal background checks for all firearm purchases, safe storage for gun owners, and Extreme Risk Protection Orders (aka "red flag laws") that allow judges to temporarily confiscate a gun from someone posing a risk to others or themselves.

These measures are going through the process of being written, edited, discussed in committee hearings, brought to the floor, and voted on. Our Gun Violence Prevention Subcommittee is actively communicating with legislators as representatives of NCJW|MI and in coalition with other organizations to be sure these bills come to fruition.

VOTING

The passage of Proposal 2, Promote the Vote 2022, was a success. But now implementation of its component parts is key. Legislation that reflects the will of the voters and funding are necessary to bring this to fruition. Early voting is a top priority and presents new challenges for municipal clerks. We continue to monitor the progress of Proposal 2 implementation and work in coalition to support this work.

REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM

Similarly, the passage of Reproductive Freedom for All, Proposal 3, requires overseeing the progress of passing meaningful legislation to implement the clear will of Michiganders on this issue. And we need strong voices to secure and protect reproductive rights on the Federal level. We hope that legislation we support has passed, or is on the brink of passing by the time you read our report.

Our voices are important. We believe that the goals are popular, and we need to continue to contact legislators to urge them to support this legislation now. Please, when you receive an Action Alert from NCJW|MI, take the action requested. We welcome your participation and invite you to join our Advocacy and Elections Committee to address these and other important issues – ones that may even arise between now and when you read this.

First Place (\$1,000) - **Nicole Pasto**, Senior at Country Day.


Second Place (\$750) - **Mag Verriest**, Junior at Berkley High School.
