They recruited local volunteer bakers and reached out to Detroit area food pantries. In the past 2 years, over 70 bakers have donated over 1,600 loaves of bread to food pantries in our community.

The ramifications of attacks on abortion access are unfolding. The fervent search to deny a women's right to choose and to seek the best medical care for herself has led to embroiling the Food and Drug Administration into the political turmoil and to cast doubt on the agency's ability to function appropriately based not on science, but on the religious belief held by a minority of Americans and their political allies who seek support at the expense of women's lives.

A lawsuit being heard by the conservative Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals attempts to reverse the FDA's approval of Mifepristone, a safe, effective, and affordable pill commonly used in medication abortion and miscarriage treatment for more than 20 years. It is expected that it will be months for a ecision to be reached in this case and that it will end up going to the United State Supreme Court. Simultaneously, the Food and Drug Administration is considering making the oral contraceptive, "The Pill," available over the counter. An advisory committee for the FDA unanimously endorsed this move in May and noted it is most effective in lowering the risk on unintended pregnancy, having more than 60 years of safe and effective use. The federal Right to Contraception Act introduced in Congress in June would codify the right of an individual to obtain and engage in contraception.

NCJWIMI was gratified to be invited by Governor Whitmer's office to witness the signing of the Safe Storage, Universal Background Checks for all firearms, and Extreme Risk Protection Order legislation into law. We are equally pleased to know that our members, coalition partners, and many members of the legislature want to accomplish more to address gun violence. We continue to monitor what bills are introduced to address this issue and work to educate and advocate for more effective gun violence prevention legislation. It is important to keep informed and to reach out to legislators by mail, email, or phone calls to remind them we are concerned and watching their progress.

It is time to begin our focus on the 2024 Elections. Legislators have passed legislation to implement the provisions of the Promote the Vote 2022 ballot initiative, which amended the State Constitution. There is a lot of work to be done to implement the changes voters overwhelmingly supported in November 2022:

1. We will educate our community on the changes to Michigan's election law, the new voting rights, and options for how one can vote.

2. We will encourage participants to assist city and township clerks who need volunteers to implement the new law.

We expect to have a busy election season. We look forward to doing our part in facilitating this change, and encourage our membership to join us.




