of Promote the Vote 2022 amends the Michigan Constitution to make voting more accessible. The summer and fall have seen the successful passage of bills that implement the provisions of that amendment, as well as other legislation. With the next Presidential election only a year away, the current task is to educate our members and community about these changes, to inform them of their benefits and to encourage registration, and getting out the vote. The changes affect Michigan voters of all ages, including making it possible to join a permanent mail

On the issue of voting, the passage

ballot list, thus eliminating the need to request an absentee ballot for every election, to automatic preregistration as young people apply for driver's licenses at the Secretary of State's office.

Federally, we continue to watch the progress of legislation that affects voting. The ironically named American Confidence in Elections (ACE) Act was introduced in July of this year to impose barriers to the ballot box with such restrictions as banning same-day voter registration, prohibiting ballot collection, restricting ballot boxes, barring universal mail-in voting. This false narrative of trying to maintain election integrity is based on the Big Lie that there was widespread voter fraud in 2020, despite the fact that every lawsuit filed to challenge elections results failed in every single state.

The Freedom to Vote Act was reintroduced. This Act was designed to bolster access to the ballot box, with such provisions as making the November Election Day a national holiday, enacting automatic voter registration for each state, requiring early voting days, restoring the right to vote in federal elections for people who have served their time for felony convictions, and ending partisan gerrymandering, among other benefits.

The Preventing Election Subversion Act is an important new piece of legislation that was introduced in July to institute comprehensive safeguards to protect elections in our country, to protect election

administration and local election officials from partisan interference, and to protect voters by requiring that challenges to their voting eligibility be supported by personal knowledge if the challenger is not an election official.

The success of the passage of Reproductive Freedom for All and the repeal of the 1931 law banning abortion have made us thankful for the advocacy and voter commitment to keep access to abortion legal in Michigan. However, there remain laws on the Michigan books that need to be removed to ensure equal and barrier-free access, including the removal of the Targeted Regulation of Abortion Providers (TRAP) laws, failure of insurance companies to cover abortion procedures, and 24-hour waiting periods.

Federally, the unsettled and uncertain legal status of reproductive healthcare continues. In July, the FDA approved the first birth control pill, Opill, for over-thecounter use. In August, the three-judge panel of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit Court rolled back FDA regulations that expanded access to the widely-used, longtime abortion pill Mifepristone, blocking retail pharmacies from distributing the abortion pill anywhere in the country, including states where abortion is legal. The judges ruled that Mifepristone can only be administered during a doctor's visit with a physician present and could no longer be sent in the mail. None of these restrictions are in effect while the legal case continues to wind its way through the courts. It is expected to go to the U.S. Supreme Court.

Packages of bills addressing Gun Violence Prevention successfully passed this year in Michigan, but the work to address gun violence in our country continues on both federal and state levels.

The work the Advocacy and Elections Committee is doing on these issues requires an active, committed group of volunteers as we shape strategies to remind people that voting is our voice, to educate on the opportunities to register and to access the ballot box, and how our state-level successes remain at-risk on a federal level. What can we do? What can you do? Please join us to find out.
