## 2024 Presidential Primary Dates

- Now: Apply for your absentee ballot online or submit a paper application
- January 18: In-person absentee voting at your <u>city or township clerk's office</u> begins.
- February 12: Last day to register to vote online or by mail to vote in the Presidential Primary. (After this date, if you still need to register to vote, you'll have to do so in person at your city or township clerk's office with proof of residency.)
- February 13: Last day to drop your absentee ballot in the mail. (After this date, drop your ballot off at your city or township clerk's office or in a secure drop box provided by your clerk.)
- February 16: Last day to spoil an already-returned absentee ballot! (After this date, your already-returned absentee ballot will be counted).
- February 17: Mandatory <u>early voting</u> period begins. All Michigan voters will be able to vote early starting on this day.
- February 25: Early voting ends. This day is the last day of early voting. After today, voters will need to vote by absentee ballot at their <u>city or township clerk's office</u> or at their <u>polling place</u> on Election Day.
- February 26: If you're registered to vote where you live, you can vote absentee in person at your <u>city or township clerk's office</u> until 4 p.m. on this day. (After that, you must vote at your <u>polling place</u> on Election Day.)
- February 27: Election Day! Polls are open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. local time. If you need to register, you can register and then vote at your city or township clerk's office
