The William Davidson Jewish College Loan Program (WDJCLP) provides interest-free loans to Jewish students from across Michigan for post-secondary study at accredited institutions. WDJCLP's loans are meant to help cover the difference between a student's total expenses for the school year and their financial resources for paying them, including Federal student loans and expected family contribution. Applicants must be enrolled full-time in a program at a college, university or graduate school that leads to a degree. NCJW | MI Education Assistance donors support the Loan Program by annually funding loans.

State Policy Advocates

2024 is an Election Year, so it is "all hands-on deck" to Get Out the Vote! The efforts will be unique this year. 2024 will require National Council of Jewish Women, Michigan election advocates to work on two fronts.

NCJW|MI is working to educate our community on the new voting rights in Michigan that resulted from the successful passage of Ballot Proposal 2 of 2022 and pro-voter legislation. Among the many election reforms, new opportunities include nine days of early voting, improvements to absentee voting and the enactment of a permanent mail ballot list, an enhanced absentee ballot tracking system, changes that ease registering to vote, preregistration for eligible teens aged 16 through

17 $\frac{1}{2}$ -years-old, and the right to hire

transportation to the polls. Knowledge of the three voting options will help voters develop a successful plan to vote.

A second concern that threatens the 2024 election is apathy. As always, it is important to ensure that Michigan voters know the stakes involved in the election. While our state has experienced great strides in securing election integrity and voting protections, abortion access, and gun safety legislation, they are under threat at the federal level. It is important for voters to engage and speak out through their votes. With U.S. Senator Debbie Stabenow retiring and House Representatives running for office in Washington and Lansing, it is important that voters go to the polls and choose the candidates who will represent their issues, interests and concerns.

The rise in antisemitism is alarming. The number of acts of antisemitic violence and hate speech is unprecedented in our country. We work with coalition partners to speak up against hate and are thankful for those partners who support us. Too many campuses are no longer havens of civil discourse and learning. Some have failed their Jewish students who are experiencing fear and the feeling of being outcasts. Members of the Advocacy and Elections Committee have reached out to Hillels at several universities across the state to let them know we support them.

This year, we are also supporting the Michigan Library Association's "MI Right to Read" campaign, a sixmonth effort to oppose censorship and book banning efforts and to protect our First Amendment right to read whatever we choose at public libraries. Michigan's State Board of Education voted in June, 2023 to take a stand against book bans and in favor of students' freedom to read diverse collections of literature. It is expected that the "Michigan Freedom to Read Act" will be introduced in the state legislature to address censorship and book bans in public libraries in Michigan.

2024 will be a busy year for advocacy. Please join us by informing the NCJW | MI office that you would like to join the Advocacy and Elections Committee or by reaching out to us.

Happy 2024! Maybe you are making your New Year's Resolutions and need just one more for a complete set. Well, we have one for you: in 2024, why not resolve to stop using single-use water bottles? It is not difficult to do, you just need to remember to bring a reusable water bottle with you when you go out. If this describes you already, you can resolve to convince your friends and family to follow your lead and ditch single-use plastic bottles of water in 2024.

Why is this important? First, for your health: disposable plastic water bottles contain harmful chemicals such as BPA that when released into the water they hold, can cause myriad health-damaging problems.

Also, for the environment: As the cartoon shows, too many disposable water bottles that Americans use (86%, in fact) become garbage or litter, putting 38 billion bottles into US landfills where the optimistic estimate says the bottles won't decompose for at least 450 years. And bottles that don't make it to a landfill are often found in our Michigan waterways and Great Lakes, where they begin as an eye-sore and eventually break up into microplastics, which are consumed by fish, birds, and animals, which is as harmful to those creatures as to humans.
