2024 is an Election Year, so all efforts are focused on Getting Out the Vote and how ALL issues inform that vote.

Strong voter turnout in 2022 led to Michigan successfully passing laws that repealed the 1931 ban on abortions and implemented the Reproductive Health Act, laws that addressed gun violence revention - Safe Storage, Extreme Risk Protection Order, Universal Background Checks for All Firearms, Protections for Domestic Violence Survivors and laws that expanded voting rights, access and security. But all of these successes remain at risk at the federal level.

Let's Both Vote (LBV), NCJW} MI's award-winning campaign to engage young and first-time

voters in the voting process continues to be an effective tool to get out the vote. It serves to both educate on the voting process and to ensure follow-through with that process. With the new, expanded voting rights, opportunities and security measures put in place with the implementation of the passage of Proposal 2 in 2022, it is important to revisit this effort to update those young people in our lives - and to educate all of those in our community who may not be aware of everything that has been accomplished with the passage of Proposal 2. This includes the addition of a minimum of nine days of early in-person voting, improvements to absentee voting and the enactment of a permanent mail ballot list, preregistration for eligible teens aged 16 through 17-1/2 years old, and the right to hire transportation to the polls. Talking points can be found on our Election 2024 webpage at ncjwmi.org/ election-2024/. More information is also available at Michigan.gov/vote (the Michigan Voter Information Center) and MichiganVoting.org. Please share these resources, not just with the young people in your life, but with all friends, family, affinity groups, co-workers - anyone who touches your life. And please watch for and share invitations from the Advocacy and Elections Committee to learn more through scheduled webinars and other opportunities that will be offered before the General Election in November.

But talking points on voting rights are only half the story. The "why voting matters" is the other half.

- 1. State legislatures and courts that support abortion bans have shown their extremism without regard to consequences for the lives involved. From the horrific court case of Texan Kate Cox, who was denied an abortion in December, 2023 even though a fatal fetal diagnosis threatened her health and future fertility, to the unconscionable ruling in February by Alabama's Supreme Court that frozen embryos are children, reproductive zealotry has proven to be hypocritical and, in reality, life-threatening.
- 2. Hate speech and acts of violence against multiple communities continues. White Nationalism espouses the "Great Replacement" theory that a conspiracy is targeting white Americans and Europeans to be "replaced" by non-white populations. This has led, in some cases, to racist violence by extremists. White Christian Nationalism is a growing influence on American politics in the United States. The misogyny, antisemitism, xenophobia, and racism directly affect our community and must be addressed. NCJW|MI proudly co-hosted a webinar in February that focused on the rise of White Christian Nationalism and its threat to democracy. Dr. Bradley Onishi, host of the podcast "Straight White American Jesus" and author of the powerful book "Preparing for War: The Extremist History of White Christian Nationalism - and What Comes Next" describes this movement that bends Christian and American principles to achieve political power. This insightful webinar can be viewed at youtu.be/5MeITE7g3xY?si=PkwA8fBlEBSl0vC4.
- 3. Book banning is a nationwide phenomenon, and Michigan is not immune. LGBTQ+ books, Holocaust books, and those featuring people of color have received the most attention. Book banning has threatened not only schools, but also our public libraries. The Michigan Library Association (MLA) launched the MI Right to Read campaign to educate the public and fight against book bans and censorship. NCJW|MI has been attending meetings to see when and where we can support this effort.

No matter what issue resonates with you, it is important to know where candidates stand on the issue and let that inform your vote. Your vote is your voice.

August 6 Statewide Primary Election – Dates To Remember

- May 23: If you are not on the Permanent Mail Ballot List to automatically receive your ballot, apply for your absentee ballot online or submit a paper application (starts 75 days before Election Day) In the two weeks before Election Day (starting July 23), it is recommended that you apply for an absentee ballot in person at your local city or township clerk's office and obtain an absentee ballot to minimize possible postal delays.
- June 27: In-person absentee voting at your city or township clerk's office begins. Absentee ballots are available 40 days before Election Day.
- July 22: Last day to register to vote online or by mail to vote in the August Primary. (After this date, if you still need to register to vote, you'll have to do so in person at your city or township clerk's office with proof of residency.)
- July 23: Last day to drop your absentee ballot in the mail. (After this date, drop your ballot off at your city or township clerk's office or in a secure drop box provided by your clerk.)
- July 26: Last day to spoil an already-returned absentee ballot! (After this date, your already-returned absentee ballot will be counted).
- July 27: Mandatory early voting period begins. All Michigan voters will be able to vote early starting on this day.
- August 4: Early voting ends. This day is the last day of early voting. After today, voters will need to vote by absentee ballot at their city or township clerk's office or at their polling place on Election Day.
- August 5: If you're registered to vote where you live, you can vote absentee in person at your city or township clerk's office until 4 p.m. on this day. (After that, you must vote at your polling place on Election Day.)
- August 6: ELECTION DAY! Polls are open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. local time. If you need to register, you can register and then vote at your city or township clerk's office until 8 p.m.

PLASTIC FREE JULY - THIS YEAR, TAKE THE CHALLENGE!

NCJW | MI has participated in the global challenge of Plastic Free July for the past several years. If you have been part of our effort, thank you! If you haven't, why not make this year the year that you join us?

Plastic Free July is a global movement that allows millions of people around the world to be part of the solution to plastic pollution . . . so we can all have cleaner streets, flourishing oceans, and healthy communities.

Plastic is more than a pervasive nuisance. It is harmful to humans, animals, birds, fish, and the planet. Plastic is made with over 10,000 chemicals, many of which are toxic like BPA and phthalates, and others that have never even been tested. Microplastics are in the air we breathe, the water we drink, and the food we eat. They have been found in human blood, lungs, veins, intestines, breast milk, and the placenta.

In Michigan, plastic threatens the rivers, lakes, and Great Lakes we love. More than 22 million pounds of plastic enters the Great Lakes each year, harming wildlife and breaking up into microplastic particles that damage the food chain and enter the bodies of fish and other water life. A recent study by the Environmental Working Group discovered that 85% of the fish it sampled from three Lake Michigan tributaries, had microplastics in their digestive tracts, including the fish we eat. Microplastic pollution has been found in every part of the waterway's food web, including mussels, algae, invertebrates, and fish.

Let's work together to reduce the plastic in our lives and on our planet. Join us by going as plastic free as you can in July! (plasticfreejuly.org) You don't have to be perfect – just try!
