
HONORING

LINDA SCHLESINGER-WAGNER WOMAN OF VISION AWARD RECIPIENT

This award is given to a member of the community who is a champion of ideals and is passionate about her convictions. She is dedicated to a particular belief or cause that greatly impacts society as a whole.

When Linda Schlesinger-Wagner needed to reinvent her career at age 60, she went back to her roots as a knitwear designer. She created skinnytees, a one-size-fits-most clothing company that began with a camisole designed to be worn under sweaters. Six years later, skinnytees is a \$6 million company and has been featured on Good Morning America, The View, and QVC. Her philanthropic spirit sponsors programs to help homeless children, shelters, medical research, and communities providing housing, food, and health services.



2024 IS AN ELECTION YEAR!

We are three months away from Election Day. But it is what we do today that also matters.

Elections are about us - we the people - expressing our values and educating ourselves to choose the candidates that align with those values - all the way down the ballot! In addition to the Presidential race, Michiganders have an important United States Senate race. There will also be state representative races, judicial races, county and local races, and school board races. Know your candidates. Learn their positions on such issues as reproductive health care, including the right to access abortion; expanding voting rights and eliminating barriers; gun violence prevention; book bans; climate change; education; immigration, economy; civil rights; racial justice; and hatred in the United States, including antisemitism. What is important to you and what's best for the country, the state, and your community?

BE AN NCJW GET-OUT-THE-VOTE INFLUENCER!

Join us in fighting apathy and antipathy in the voting process. There are several ways you can make a difference:

- Participate in our Let's Both Vote campaign to encourage others to register to vote, to make a plan to vote, and to follow through with that plan by working closely with family, friends, affinity groups, and neighbors.
- Attend an important webinar, How Recent Supreme Court Decisions Have Eroded the Separation Between Church and State, on September 12 at 7 p.m. with Dan Korobkin, Legal Director at ACLU of Michigan. More details will follow.
- Join us for a letter-writing party at a private home on September 13th to encourage new and inconsistent voters to vote in November.
- Learn about the new voting options from Mackenzie Walz, Election Protection Counsel|Promote the Vote, during How to Vote in Michigan on September 18 at 7 p.m. via zoom. Watch for more details.
- Participate in Know Your Voting Rights in Michigan: What Questions Do You Have? on October 9th via zoom. An SPA will review voting rights in Michigan and answer attendees' questions.

Note: Letter-writing parties and zoom programs require prior registration.

NOVEMBER 5: ELECTION DAY - DATES TO REMEMBER

- September 26: In-person absentee voting at your city or township clerk's office begins.
- October 21: Last day to register to vote online or by mail to vote in the November 5th General Election. After this date, register or update your registration in person at your city or township clerk's office with proof of residency.
- October 22: Last day to drop absentee ballot in mail. After this date, it is recommended that registered voters request and take their absentee ballot to their city or township clerk's office or put it in a secure drop box provided by your clerk.
- October 25: Last day to spoil an already-returned absentee ballot.
- October 26: Mandatory early voting period of nine days begins. All Michigan voters will be able to vote early at their designated early voting site. Ballots provided at the site and absentee ballots completed at home can be put in the tabulator.
- November 3: Final day of early voting. After this date, you will need to vote by absentee ballot at your city or township clerk's office or at your polling place on Election Day.
- November 4: If you're registered to vote where you live, you can request an absentee ballot and vote absentee at your city or township clerk's office until 4 p.m. on this day.
- November 5: Election Day:Last day to return Absentee Ballot by 8 p.m. to city or township clerk's office or dropbox. Last opportunity to register to vote, update registration, and vote in-person at your city or township clerk's office until 8 p.m. Registered voters must vote at the polls, open from 7 a.m. - 8 p.m.

NCJW GREEN

Reduce, Reuse . . . Recycle????

Remember that mantra? It was created sometime in the mid-70s and perhaps you or your children were taught a "3 Rs" song in elementary school, extolling the benefits of those actions.

Today we know that "reduce" and "reuse" are still good plans, but "recycle?" That is another story.

Recycling is effective for some materials: paper, cardboard, glass, cans – those items are successfully recycled and put to new uses. So, keep putting them (clean, of course) in your curbside recycling bin.

It is plastic that is the big problem. Plastic is only recycled in the U.S. at a rate of about 5% - no matter what you see on TV these days in ads created by the Plastics Industry Association. Contrast that with paper, which is recycled at a rate of 66%. Plastic is the most common material in most of our homes, it never fully breaks down and it isn't recyclable. That is a big problem.

Instead of focusing on recycling plastic (which is unsuccessful), let's all try to use those other Rs when it comes to plastic: REDUCE the amount of plastic that you buy. REUSE plastic you already own, rather than throwing it out (but whatever you do, don't microwave food in plastic or put plastic in your dishwasher. The heat breaks the plastic down and releases toxins that are not healthy.) You can add a couple of other "Rs." REFUSE to buy products that are composed of or packaged in plastic, look for alternatives. And RETHINK whether you actually need to buy that item at all if alternatives aren't available.

Working together, we can make a difference in the health of our family, our community and our planet.


